Thank you Regina High School Alumnae for creating and sustaining the RHS traditions. Your continued support and contributions is why our community continues to flourish.



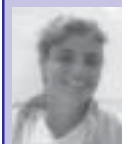
Jennifer Paruk, Student Council President

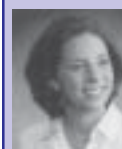

It was with some apprehension that I approached this “autobiographical essay” assignment since revisiting “the blank sheet of white paper” is always a daunting task especially when considering my audience—YOU who’ve already “been there/done that”. Additionally, my hesitation was rooted in trying to formulate an interesting and intriguing invocation that would truly inspire all of you RHS alumnae to reconnect to your alma mater in whatever capacity you can currently support it. Alas the muse of my life’s story is elusive and the publishing deadline is imminent, so instead of an inspired treatise there are only these meager thoughts gleaned from my inauspicious, yet, nonetheless, rewarding teaching career.

First, whenever asked about my job, it is with great pride that I acknowledge my profession as that of an English teacher. It is a satisfying profession and one in which you immerse yourself and others in the most literate language, scholarly texts and profound ideas from Sophocles to Shakespeare or Poe to Plath. (Do you recall Sylvia’s “sticky pearl” simile?) Who could not thrive on a daily dose of poetic insight and what better way to prepare for a law degree, a medical diagnosis or a business conundrum than to plod through archaic, though not arcane, prose and poetic passages? Also in our frenetic 21st Century culture that seems to be increasingly “a-literate” with text-messages, sound-bites, e-mails and easy access to downloaded plot summaries via

Cliff’s notes, the discipline to read a long novel, write an articulate essay, think thoughts and listen attentively are not only essential but an antidote to cultural “Instah” illiteracy.

After explaining my profession, the same inquisitive souls might grimace in fear, look horrified or recoil in disgust saying “How can you teach the kids today?” At this point my response to these naysayers is that I’m ever encouraged by the wonderful, beautiful and inspiring Regina students who never cease to rise to multiple challenges whether it’s a Christian service project or an impromptu essay. The Marley’s ghost of former Reginites visits as I recall the Caileighs and Kaitlins; the Lauras and Marias; the Christas and Katrinas; the Erins/Emilys; the Alexandras and Sarahs; the Rhondas and Anitas and multitudes of other wonderful students of past, present and future classes to come. Regina students emerge as great learners as well as great leaders and are in the words of Shelley an “unbridled joy” to teach.

Fortunately, my path led to Regina after it began with a BA in English, Education, Social Studies, Humanities and reading. My teaching career began at The Friends School in Detroit which is affiliated with the American Society of Friends who has established schools throughout the country. The Quakers are dedicated to social justice issues and a culture of non-violence which attracted me to the job. While there I gained teaching experience and established wonderful friendships that I so value and that continue in my life today. While at Friends I enrolled in a Graduate Program at the University of Windsor becoming a Teaching Assistant. Many of my classes were taught by the Professor Smiths (Joyce Carol Oates) Smith and her husband Professor Raymond Smith both of whom later moved from Windsor to teach at Princeton University. Joyce Carol Oates continues to be a pre-eminent American author. This

experience prepared me for a continued dedication to the life of literature and language studies. Soon after my MA, I started a family, taught at Dominican High School and then came to teach at Regina where I currently teach American Literature and Composition, Honors World/British Literature and Advanced Placement English classes. Concurrent to teaching, I helped to raise my family—two sons and a daughter. Julia just graduated from U of M in 2005 while her brothers graduated from U of M several years prior (Go Blue!) and have completed their MA degrees. Jonathan is in China doing his doctoral studies on alternative fuel and energy sources. My interests include: continuing to read works of literary merit, attending professional conferences, attending cultural events, supporting the arts, gardening in the very loosest sense of this term, food science, cooking and Physics—most notably the Chaos theory. Once in a great while I’ll dabble in water colors. Though teaching and child-rearing have absorbed most of my time, new adventures beckon; moreover, I continue to aspire to teach English to the ever new Reginites in the magnificent new venue.

While teaching at Regina, it has been a great privilege to be in the presence of great leadership (Sr. Leanne and Sr. Hyacinth), to have great opportunity for spiritual enrichment, to know the joy of collegiality with my fellow English department and to appreciate the wonderful people who comprise the Regina faculty and staff. Most importantly, it has been a supreme privilege to have optimal teaching conditions by having the finest of students and knowing their wonderful families which is the greatest of gifts. May God continue to bless you and in the words of Joseph Campbell “Follow Your Bliss” and take Thoreau’s advice to “Live the life you’ve imagined”!

Career Day 2006



Alumnae return to Regina to give advice to future leaders

A forensic scientist, a journalist, a clinical social worker: These are just a few of the twenty five welcomed guests who presented at Regina's Career Day that was held Friday, March 10th. Alumnae, parents of former and current students, and interested community members were among the visitors who shared their career pathways and experiences with our students.

The day began in the auditorium as students listened attentively to our keynote speaker, Ms. Lynette Halalay, a local image consultant and motivational speaker. The topic of her very effective Power Point presentation and demonstration was "Etiquette in Every Day Life, and in the Business World." Our students were given much food for thought about how to behave in social and business settings, the importance of first impressions, and how to present their best foot forward "visually, vocally and verbally."



The Post Secondary Options committee of Regina's NCA School Improvement team was largely responsible for Career Day as a strategy for improving our students' methods of career planning and decision making.

Prior to the event, students were invited to indicate what kinds of careers they would like to hear about. Although it is impossible to cover every area of interest, there was great effort to cover the "career pathways" that are integrated into the My Dream Explorer/MOIS instructional system that is being infused into Regina's curriculum. Once it was determined where the students' areas of interest were, potential speakers were invited to share their areas of expertise via a 30 minute session using props, materials or activities that would enhance their presentation. Each student was assigned three different speaker presentations.



Part of the fun was on the day prior, when our homeroom teachers modeled and shared their own careers as teachers, and perhaps their other careers that their students might not be aware of. Students were able to practice their good questioning and listening skills as they interacted with their own teachers. The overall evaluation of Career Day '06 was that a good time was had by all.

REGINA HIGH SCHOOL BRINGS JOY TO HOSPITALIZED CHILDREN



This March, the Student Council of Regina High School organized a fundraiser to raise money to purchase "fun" band-aids with cartoon characters for the patients at Children's Hospital. The Student Council organized this fundraiser to correspond with the school's spirit week. Spirit week is a week where the school is divided into four colors. Each color competes against each other to win points. These points are earned through different activities including: trivia games, themed dress days, and spirit games.

To incorporate the fundraiser into spirit week, the Student Council sold "charity chain" links for 25 cents a piece. Each color

created their own chain to hang down the halls of Regina High School. This competitive spirit helped the Student Council to raise \$350, which bought over 260 band-aids.
